## Arbitraging Covered Interest Rate Parity Deviations and Bank Lending [paper]

Revise and Resubmit at American Economic Review

I propose and test a new channel through which bank lending is affected in an emerging markets setting. This channel is that when banks arbitrage covered interest rate parity (CIP) deviations, they need to borrow in a particular currency. In the presence of borrowing frictions, banks shift part of the resources used to lend to households and firms to fund their arbitrage activities.

The Role of Family Networks in Access to the First Credit, with Miguel Angel Carpio and Alessandro Tomarchio [paper]

We use the universe of loans made in 518 districts of Southern Peru to show that first-time borrowers have higher probability of receiving a loan and with better conditions from the bank where their families are more central. The evidence we have found suggests that banks, and particularly those catering the informal sector, may provide initial loans to family members of their existing clients as a means of retaining their current clientele.

## Capital Controls and Risk Misallocation: Evidence from a Natural Experiment [paper]

I exploit heterogeneity in the strictness of capital controls across Peruvian banks to provide novel causal evidence of the effect of capital controls on firms' dollar borrowing from banks.
